1. It was built with two parallel naves — one for the nuns of the adjacent Benedictine convent and one for the parish, divided by a partition until the dissolution of the priory in 1538.
2. The Northwest Passage — a sea route through the Arctic from the Atlantic to the Pacific.
3. It was condemned as a pagan idol.
4. He places a new quill pen in the marble fingers of Stow's effigy.
5. King Lucius.
6. The great Roman basilica of Londinium, built around AD 90 to 120.
7. Christopher Wren rebuilt the body of the church after the Great Fire; Nicholas Hawksmoor designed the upper stages of the Gothic tower, completed in 1722; Sir George Gilbert Scott remodelled the interior in the 1850s.
8. Scratch marks on the masonry, said to be the Devil's claw marks.
9. Elegy Written in a Country Churchyard.
10. 1652, founded by a Greek entrepreneur named Pasqua Rosée.
